<b>3</b>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, is adequately focused:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>includes setting and narrator and /or characters</li> <li>adequate sequence of events from beginning to end</li> <li>use of transitional words to signal event order</li> <li>adequate closing</li> </ul>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, provides adequate elaboration:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>includes details to elaborate on what happened</li> <li>includes details to describe the thoughts and/or feelings of characters</li> <li>includes sensory and concrete language to describe characters, setting, and/or events</li> </ul>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, demonstrates an adequate command of conventions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>forms complete simple sentences with proper subject verb agreement most of the time</li> <li>uses capitalization for the first word in a sentence the pronoun "I", dates, and names of people most of the time</li> <li>spells words with common spelling patterns and frequently occurring irregular words and uses inventive spelling for all other words that are decipherable most of the time</li> <li>uses end punctuation most of the time</li> <li>uses commas in dates and to separate single words in a series (if used)</li> </ul>
<b>2</b>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, is somewhat focused and organized:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>may exclude either character or setting</li> <li>uneven or inconsistent sequence of events</li> <li>inconsistent or limited use of transitional words to signal event order</li> <li>closing, if present, may be weak or patterned</li> <li>weak connection among ideas</li> </ul>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, provides some elaboration:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>uneven or limited use of details to elaborate on what happened</li> <li>limited use of details to describe characters and or setting</li> </ul>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, demonstrates a partial command of conventions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>has many capitalization errors</li> <li>spelling errors interfere with reading</li> <li>inconsistent use of punctuation</li> </ul>
<b>1</b>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, lacks focus and organization:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>may be very brief, off topic, or include extraneous details</li> <li>fails to narrate an event</li> <li>may be confusing</li> <li>no transitional words</li> </ul>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, provides minimal elaboration:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>minimal or irrelevant details</li> </ul>	<p><b>The narrative, real or imagined, demonstrates a lack of command of conventions by:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>errors in capitalization, punctuation, and spelling are frequent and meaning is often obscured</li> </ul>
