

Synthetic Turf Use Guidelines

Use of the District's synthetic turf fields is by permit only. To protect the field surface, prolong the life span of the fields, and avoid conflict between user groups, the Long Beach Unified School District asks that every approved user be aware of the field use guidelines. In addition, users are responsible for the conduct and behavior of their coaches, players, referees and spectators on the field during their rental.

The following rules and regulations shall be in effect at all times and apply to everyone using the field:

- Only players, coaches and league officials are allowed on the playing turf.
- Group leaders / coaches are required to remain with the group at all times and are responsible for the group's conduct and compliance with all rules.
- No spectators allowed on field or track at any time.
- No furnishings on the field (i.e. tables, chairs, any equipment with sharp or narrow legs etc.).
- No vehicles, bicycles, skateboarding, and inline skating.
- No sharp objects such as stakes, corner flags or poles that may penetrate or damage the turf.
- No metal cleats or spikes. No cleats longer than 3/4 inch.
- No high-heeled shoes. Wedge-type shoes are acceptable.
- No food or colored and/or sweetened beverages on the field – only water is allowed. Please deposit all water bottles in the trash after use. No glass of any kind.
- No gum or sunflower seeds on the field.
- No spitting or other bodily fluids.
- No on-site food preparation.
- No BBQ's: Charcoal or gas, no open flames.
- No smoking or tobacco products of any kind.
- No pets allowed on the turf or in the stadium.
- No balloons or balloon scraps.
- No confetti and/or confetti cannons.
- No fireworks, including poppers.
- No field use when lightning is evident.
- No field markings of any sort.
- No drone aircrafts.
- No duct tape or tape of any kind.
- No noise makers, air horns, etc.
- Groups must pick up all garbage on turf and in bleachers after use.

Failure to comply with the field rules may result in financial penalties or loss of permitting privileges.
